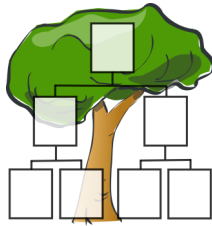

The Library provides some supplies too, such as embroidery floss and beads for crocheted bead necklaces (with crochet help). Adult coloring pages and colored pencils are also available.

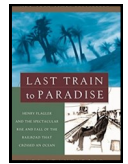

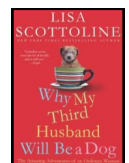

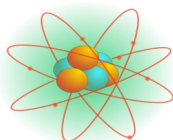
